First off I want to thank our outgoing Comms officer Lisa Sinclair for giving me invaluable experience on her communications committee and advice before she left. I'd also like to extend my thanks to my excellent team on my communications committee, including Justin Friesen, Carla Manfredi, Melissa Funke, Matthew Flisfeder in the Fall term, and Chris Wiebe in the Winter term. Thank you also to Jay and the Membership Committee for planning exciting solidarity and social events that we were able to promote to our members, complete with flashy posters.

One of our main goals this year was to revive the UWFA newsletter which we've done, and we produced a Fall issue and a Spring issue, which you can grab today and will be in your mailboxes soon. We've called it The Crow's Nest and we're very happy to include a submission if you have one, so get in touch if there's something you'd like to see in it. We're currently batting around the idea of a summer issue that could include some short pieces from members about their research or community work, so stay tuned for that.

Something that was central to our objectives this year also was getting our membership comfortable with the idea of potential job action, and doing it quickly.
